The Lynn Public Schools (LPS) has created an inclusive Summer School that allows students, coupled with the support of LPS teachers, to complete courses through Apex online courses. The goal of Summer School is to provide a solid, meaningful learning environment that will better prepare students for the next academic school year.

Program Specifics:

- Registration Period: June 27, 2018 – July 2, 2018
- Session Dates: July 9th – August 9th (Monday thru Thursday)
- **Mandatory Orientation – Monday, July 9th – 8:00 AM**
- 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM
- Breakfast (7:30 AM) & Lunch (12:00 PM) Provided
- \$125 for one course (LPS); \$200 (non LPS)
- \$25 for each additional course (LPS); \$25 (non LPS)
- One course = One Subject (regardless of quarters assigned)

Registration & Policies

- The Registration Period is June 27, 2018 – July 2, 2018 from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM in the Guidance Departments of Lynn English and Lynn Classical.
- Students must consult with their guidance counselor and obtain all appropriate signatures on the front side of this application before registering for Summer School.
- **VERY IMPORTANT: (1) A completed Emergency Form (both sides) and a Final Transcript must be attached to this application. (2) Guidance must ensure student has a working LPS User Name & Password.**
- Quarterly Assignments:
 - 4 Failed School Quarters = 3 Assigned Summer School Quarters
 - 3 Failed School Quarters = 2 Assigned Summer School Quarters
 - 2 Failed School Quarters = 1 Assigned Summer School Quarter
- Lynn Classical students should register at and attend the Lynn Classical Summer School program. Lynn English students should register at and attend the Lynn English Summer School program. Fecteau-Leary, Lynn Vocational Technical Institute, and non-LPS students can register at and attend either program.
- The total tuition cost must be paid in full at registration time. Only cash and money orders will be accepted. No personal checks or credit/debit cards.
- A \$20.00 fee will be assessed for students who register once Summer School has started.
- Students wishing to take more than two courses must finish the first two courses and then complete any additional courses. Payment in full for all courses is due at registration. No refunds will be processed for courses not finished. Therefore, students must be mindful of completing their course(s) within the Summer School calendar. The absolute latest that a course can be completed is Thursday, August 9th, 11:30 AM.
- Some courses are either semester courses or full year courses that are not broken up into quarters; therefore, some students may need to complete more work than necessary because of this format; the majority of SPED and ELL courses are semesters.
- Students must attend at least **two hours each day for each assigned subject** until they finish the course.
- Student attendance will be recorded in each classroom.
- Students with more than four (4) absences will be dismissed from the program and receive F letter grades.
- Any tardy over 15 minutes will be considered an absence.
- Students are not permitted in any other areas of the school except the computer labs, cafeteria, and lavatory rooms.
- Students complete a course by finishing all quizzes and exams and by earning a 60% or better final average.
- It is possible for students to complete their course(s) before the Summer School program concludes.
- Students need to notify the classroom teacher when a course is completed.

- Students need to check out with the Summer School Director once all courses have been completed.
- Students will be issued a final grade upon completion of a course. The course and grade will be posted on the student's transcript. The grade does **not** count towards the student's cumulative grade point average. Non-LPS students will receive a letter of successful completion to present to their own schools.
- If a student completes and fails a course, the teacher can reset the assessments for a maximum three (3) times. If the student has failed after the third reset, the student will receive an F.
- The vast majority of Summer School work is done on-site.
- When students move from classroom to classroom, they must login and logout of the computer each time.
- If a student is removed from Summer School for disciplinary reasons, no refunds will be made.
- An orientation and schedule distribution will occur in a general assembly on the first day – Monday, July 9th, 8:00 AM.
- The following subject teachers will be available to assist students at each high school: English Language Arts, History, Science, Mathematics, Special Education, and English Language Learners.
