



THE LYNN VOCATIONAL TECHNICAL AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM (T.A.P) at Lynn Vocational Technical Institute provides an opportunity for high school students to take vocational courses. Students may choose to do so to gain employable skills or for personal enrichment purposes.

Students should work with their guidance counselors to determine which course offering best suits their future career goals. Vocational and student support services, including but not limited to career counseling are provided to maximize success.

Vocational courses taken at LVTI will assist students in gaining competency in a vocational area. Our objective is to enhance a student's potential of gainful employment after completion of a 10-week vocational cycle.

- Students will receive 1.0 credit after successful completion of 10 weeks

Adobe Illustrator & Screen printing – Skill set that can be gained in a 60 hour course

Student will get an overview of Adobe Illustrator. Create T-shirt designs and prepare screens for silk screening. One, Two, and three color silk screens will be done. Learn how to use a digital and offset press. Design basics with hands on silkscreen techniques.

- Course will be great for students working on art portfolio (college). Students interested in the fashion industry, graphic design, or screen print business.

Culinary Arts – Skill set that can be gained in a 60 hour course

Students will become ServSafe® Food Handler certified. The five sections are Basic Food Safety, personal hygiene, cross-contamination and allergens, time and temperature, and cleaning and sanitation. students will also learning knifing and cooking skills. Student will also learn wait staff basics and serve at a function.

- Course will be great for students interested in the food service industry as a career/college or looking for food service industry skills for a summer job.
