The purpose of the program is to provide scholarships in Bradley's name to students in the public school system in their senior year of high school who will be attending a state or nationally accredited college or university in the fall of 2026 or have joined the U.S. Armed Forces during their senior year in high school.

These scholarships will be awarded on the basis of academic merit, an original essay, awards and recognition, and extracurricular and community service activities. Consideration will be given to those eligible applicants from all Lynn public high schools. Applications and all supporting materials must be received (hard copies) or emailed by **Friday, 27 March 2026 by 5:00 EST** and will be reviewed by the LCpl Bradley Campus Memorial Scholarship Committee. This year we will award **three (3)** scholarships - each scholarship will be in the amount of **\$1,000.00**.

About LCpl Bradley Campus

Bradley J. Campus was born in Lynn, MA on February 15, 1962. He attended Lynn English High School, and upon graduation, he joined the U.S. Marine Corps. While stationed overseas, he was thinking about the next stage of his life, and goals he had. Bradley desired to open his own bakery in the North End of Boston after serving in the military.

Unfortunately, his dreams never came true, because on 23 October 1983 Bradley was killed in the Beirut bombing by two (2) suicide bombers who drove a truck into the Marine Barracks. Lance Corporal Bradley Campus was one (1) of 241 American service members that were killed on that day.

Bradley was known as a person who possessed the qualities of kindness, integrity, dedication, dependability, loyalty, sincerity, seriousness, humor, independence, and was an overall intelligent young man.

We are called to honor our veterans, and the Committee is honored to be able to offer this scholarship in his name.

2026 Application Requirement

Judging:	Decisions will be based on a transcript of your high school grades for senior year (to date) and junior year (full year), an essay judged on the quality of writing, awards and recognition and extracurricular and community service activities. The judges shall disregard race, gender, age, color of skin, and any other factors that may constitute discrimination. All Scholarship Committee decisions are final.
Entry Criteria:	The student must be a Lynn, MA resident graduating high school and plan to attend a state or nationally accredited two or four-year college or university or has joined the U.S. Armed Forces.
Essay:	The essay should answer the question: " What is the significance of Memorial Day and what does it represent to me? " The essay cannot be more than 500 words in length. Do not include any identifying names or references in the essay. The essay must be completed in a Word processing (e.g., Microsoft Word, Google Docs, etc.) application. Proper use of grammar, punctuation, and spelling will be reviewed and taken into consideration by the Scholarship Committee.
Rules:	All applications must include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Completed cover sheet• Essay• Copy of current high school transcript YTD (senior year)• Copy of junior year transcript• Two (2) letters of recommendation by a teacher or coach Entries must be received by 5:00 p.m. (EST) on Friday, 27 March 2026 . All applications and supporting materials must be received by the deadline date and time. Any materials missing, or received after the deadline date and time will not be considered, regardless of the circumstances.
